

Our members choose the books that they want to read, so we cover a large variety of subjects, both fiction and non-fiction. The books can be ordered through the Library System. Please join us! Our next books will be:

April 5, 2023 at 1:30 PM - The Litigators by John Grisham – 2011 - 385 pages. Law firm partners Finley and Figg see an opportunity for huge financial gain when they learn of a pending class action lawsuit against the makers of a popular cholesterol reducing drug.

May 3, 2023 at 1:30 PM - Spying on the South: an odyssey across the American divide by Tony Horwitz – Call # 975 H824- 2019 - 420 pages. The author retraces the journey of Frederick Law Omstead across the American South in the 1850's, on the eve of the Civil War. Olmstead roamed 11 states and 6,000 miles. The New York Times published his dispatches about slavery and its defenders.

June 7, 2023 at 1:30 PM - Behind the Beautiful Forevers: life, death and hope in a Mumbai under-city by Katherine Boo — Call # 362.50954 B724 -2012 - 265 pages. Annawadi is a makeshift settlement in the shadow of luxury hotels near the Mumbai airport. The story takes you into the lives of the people of this settlement.

July 5, 2023 at 1:30 PM - Run, Rose, Run by Dolly Parton and James Patterson - 2022 - 439 pages. A thriller about a young singer-songwriter on the rise and on the run. She is determined to do whatever it takes to survive.


