Our members choose the books they wish to read, so we cover a large variety of subjects, both fiction and non-fiction. The books can be ordered through the library system. Our next books will be:

**February 7, 2024 at 1:30pm - Big Little Lies** by Liane Moriarty - 2014 - 460 pages. What could be worse than a riot at Pirriwee Public School's annual Trivia Night? A parent is dead and the suspicion is that it may have been murder.

March 6, 2024 at 1:30pm - Dragon Teeth: a novel by Michael Crichton -2017 - 295 pages. A tale set in the Wild West during the golden age of fossil hunting. The story follows the exploits of two rival paleontologists who sabotage each other in what comes to be known as the Bone Wars.

**April 3, 2024 at 1:30pm - The Maid** by Nita Prose - 2022 - Mystery - 289 pages. Molly's orderly life as a hotel maid is upended the day she enters the suite of infamous and wealthy Charles Black, only to find it in a state of disarray and Mr. Black dead.

May 1, 2024 at 1:30pm - The Roaring Days of Zora Lily by Noelle Salazar -2023 - 408 pages. While preparing "The Hollywood Glamour" exhibition at the Smithsonian, a conservator discovers another name beneath a label and unearths the story of a poverty-stricken seamstress who realizes her dream of becoming a designer.
