




July 11, 2012 Founding Mothers: The Women Who Raised Our Nation

by Coke Roberts – 2004 – Call # 920.073 - 359 pages.

An intimate look at the patriotic and passionate women whose tireless pursuits on behalf of their families and their country proved as critical to the forging of a new nation as the rebellion that established it. The book includes Abigail Adams, Mercy Otis Warren, Deborah Read Franklin, Eliza Pickney, Catherine Littlefield Green, Ester De Berdt Reed, and Martha Washington.

August 1, 2012 Hotel on the Corner of Bitter and Sweet

by Jamie Ford - Fiction – 2009.

In this story Henry Lee, a Chinese-American living in Seattle, loses his wife to cancer in 1986. When Henry hears of a hotel where the belongings of Japanese immigrants interned during WWII have been found in the basement it brings back memories of his childhood relationship with Keiko Okabe, a Japanese girl who was the only other Asian student in his private school in the 1940's.

September 5, 2012 State of Wonder

by Ann Patchett – Fiction – 2011 - 353 pages.

Marina Singh, a pharmacologist, is sent to the Amazon delta to investigate the death of a colleague and to check on the progress of Dr. Annick Swenson who has been working on a fertility drug. The book is a suspenseful trip to the crossroads of science, ethics and commerce.

October 3, 2012 Mudbound

by Hillary Jordan – Fiction – 2008 – 328 pages.

The book is set on a desolate farm in the Mississippi Delta at the end of WW II. It explores the complex relations between two families: the owners of the land and the sharecroppers who live and work on it.



Rated PG; 92 minutes



into a living hell.


Jul 31 Zombieland 6:00 PM – Tuesday

There'll be music in the air when soprano Jennifer Ann Seidman and baritone Andy S. Watson join forces to perform a variety of show tunes. The one-hour free concert gives audiences an intimate entertainment experience with a couple of musical pros who continue to win praises wherever they perform.

Seidman, who began singing as a child nearly two decades ago, realized her penchant for vocal performance at the conclusion of her undergraduate studies at the University of Redlands, when she was required to give a major vocal recital. Her expertise in musical performance was furthered after she received her Master's Degree in Operatic Performance from Longy School of Music of Bard College.

During the same period of time, Watson was steadily honing his singing skill, performing professionally with several operas in the San Diego area, including the San Diego Opera.

After Seidman and Watson met by chance at a musical event, soon thereafter, the two began combining their musical talent and appearing at a variety of venues throughout California. Their love of music eventually blossomed into a romantic connection, perhaps, adding a bit more authenticity to their onstage amorous duets. For audiences, the result can only be a sharing of musical bliss.


