New to me – Louise Penny

I love finding a new mystery series that has several books already written. I track several authors, but it is always frustrating waiting for the next to be released. Well, a friend saved me by recommending Louise Penny. There are at least 14 books in the series and she is still writing, with the next title due out August of this year. She is a Canadian author, and the series is centered in Quebec. The central character is a police investigator, Chief Inspector Armand Gamache, who, (along with his team) seems to find himself over and over again in a small town called Three Pines. The town has its own quirky characters which include B&B owners, a local artist, a world -renowned poet, and a bookstore owner. The books are not a challenging read, and although each book stands on its own, I do recommend reading them in order to follow the character development and understand further in jokes between characters as the books move along. All the books are available for borrowing through the LAPL. I have read some in-hand as well as electronic. The first book in the series is called Still Life. Audio books are available as well. I am on the hold list for book 14, I love this feature about reserving place in line for new releases! The only sad thing is I am now caught up, so will need to find somebody new.
