Book Club: Clara Woll

The Chatsworth Library Book Club meets the first Wednesday of each month (except Library holidays) at 1:30pm. We are now holding hybrid, in-person and Zoom, meetings. The inperson meetings are held in the Community Room of the LAPL -Chatsworth Branch, which is located at 21052 Devonshire Street, phone (818) 341-4276. For an invitation to participate via Zoom, e-mail sstamm@lapl.org.

Our members choose the books they wish to read, so we cover a large variety of subjects, both fiction and non-fiction. The books can be ordered through the library system.

Our next books will be: November 1, 2023 at 1:30pm – **The Lincoln Highway** by Amor Towles - 2021 -576 pages. In June 1954, eighteen-year-old Emmett Watson is driven to his family farm in Nebraska by the warden of the juvenile work farm. He plans to pick up his younger brother and go to California to start a new life, but his plans are changed by two friends from the work farm.

December 6, 2023 at 1:30pm– Lessons in Chemistry: a novel by Bonnie Garmus - 2022 - 390 pages. Set in 1960's California, this is the story of a female scientist whose career is constantly being derailed by the idea that a woman's place is in the home. Elizabeth Lott finds herself the host of America's most beloved cooking show. She is not just teaching women how to cook, but how to change the status quo.
